Dr. Vito Intini is an experienced economist who has held various positions in the United Nations. He served as the Senior Macroeconomic Adviser at UN DESA in New York, where he was responsible for several key areas including global macroeconomic forecasting, socioeconomic assessments of large infrastructure projects, and developing quantitative methods to measure SDG interactions and prioritize them. He also contributed to the development of SDG costing and budgeting frameworks and co-led the preparation of the UN guidance on Economic Transformation. In addition to his work at UN DESA, Dr. Intini previously served as the leader of the global program on Municipal Finance at UNCDF.

Dr. Vito Intini has extensive experience in various international organizations and the academic field. He served as the Chief of the Economic Governance Section at ESCWA in Beirut, where he led several publications and capacity building programs. His work at ESCWA included expertise in measuring inequality, developing national sustainable development strategies, fiscal policy, development in conflict, and market competition. Prior to his work at ESCWA, he served as a Private and Financial Sector Specialist at the World Bank in the Balkan region.

Dr. Intini has also worked for several other international organizations, including the OECD, OSCE, EU, as well as the academic field. He has specialized in International Economics and holds various Master's degrees in Environmental Policies, Development, and Labor Economics.
